FAMILY NURSE PRACTITIONER (FNP) CERTIFICATE

The Department of Nursing's Post-Graduate APRN Certificate programs are for advanced practice nurse leaders who already hold at least one certification as a nurse practitioner, nurse anesthetist, clinical nurse specialist, or nurse midwife.

The Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) certificate includes theory online, on campus days for skills and simulation, and precepted clinical experiences.
