Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the MS in Teaching students will:

1. Increase specific academic and professional competencies through research
2. Develop an appreciation of knowledge and engage in intellectual stimulus to help ground professional practice in research.
3. Understand IRB guidelines for adequately protecting research participants at the institutional, federal, and global levels review research studies to ensure that they comply with applicable regulations, meet commonly accepted ethical standards, follow institutional policies, and adequately protect research participants.
4. Examine the concepts of inquiry and ideation to address a problem of practice.
5. Apply inquiry and ideation to a Mini-Problem of Practice for equity outcomes.
